

Algonquin Middle School - \$5,400

Project Funway: Materials will be purchased for use by the after school sewing club.

Seventh Grade Service Project: Seventh grade students are encouraged to give back to the community through a variety of service projects.

Fern Schumer Chapman author visit: Ms. Chapman has penned 6 books about surviving the Holocaust. Her mother is her inspiration as well as her companion on this visit.

AMS Family Literacy Night: A literacy night event is planned for Algonquin students and their younger siblings.

AMS Musical Nursing Home Tour: Select student musicians, and three musical directors, make the trip to entertain the residents of several area nursing homes.

AMS Summer reading program: This is an annual undertaking to encourage students to read over the summer. Students that are not able to afford a library membership will have access to a copy of the book that is chosen. Student workshops and activities are planned for the Fall.

BEAMZ: BEAMZ is an innovating music program that uses beams of light to make music. Students pass their hands through beams of light to create sound and music. Students can create music safely and without sharing equipment. The program can be used on computers, iPads, smart phones, etc.

Percussion equipment for Band: The number and quality of the percussion instruments will be increased.

Chippewa Middle School - \$3,797

Classroom rewards for positive behaviors: Incentives would be purchased as rewards for positive behavior.

Helping Hands Coffee Cart: A functioning coffee cart will give students with disabilities some real life job training skills. With the support of staff and peer buddies they will interact with customers, fill orders, & deliver.

Chippewa Cares: Incentives and rewards will be purchased for use in the positive behavior reward program. (PBIS)

Cameras for Yearbook Club: New cameras will be purchased for use by the Yearbook Club students.

CMS literacy night: Chippewa will host it's 3rd annual family literacy night emphasizing the importance of reading.

Building Readers: Books will be purchased from Scholastic as incentives and/or rewards for intervention students.

Central Elementary School - \$2,200

Music Virtual Field Trip: Students will be spectators at a virtual musical performance offered through Poway Onstage. The variety offers something for everyone and is supported by a pre-show learning module as well as extension activities.

Ukulele Grant: Ukuleles will be purchased to round out the school's current supply and provide a full class set.

Author study with Rob Buyea: A favorite author of 5th grade students and teachers will visit the school as a special way to celebrate an otherwise celebration free & field trip free school year.

Cumberland Elementary School - \$1,000

Sensory Space: A variety of resources will be purchased to create a sensory space for use primarily by the BEST class. Other Cumberland students, on a per needed basis, could benefit from this space as well. In times of student stress or anxiety some of the supporting activities in the sensory space would include calming auditory apparatus such as sound machines, weighted blankets, aroma therapy, hanging chairs, gel mats, as well as other items.

Forest Elementary School - \$1,000

Becoming an Author: Author visit by Kevin Luthardt, a local author. All students at Forest would participate. One class of students at Cumberland as well.

Iroquois Community School - \$1,724

High Interest Books for students: Books will be purchased for use by 2nd grade students.

Social/Emotional support: Books will be used for discussing behaviors and emotions. Book topics - respect, kindness, responsibility, honesty, etc.

Motivational Speaker: An America's Got Talent semi-finalist will perform a live show. He does BMX bike stunts that entertain and engage the students and talks about perseverance, self-confidence, bike safety and bullying.

North Elementary School - \$500

Connecting Communities: North will organize two 'Zoom' nights for families and students centered around STEAM activities. Local community stakeholders will be contacted and asked to contribute unique resources and/or offer STEAM activities.

Orchard Place Elementary School - \$3,000

Creative Well-Being: This program focuses on the special needs population at Orchard Place. Special tools, books, etc. will be purchased for use in the classroom to emphasize self-regulation, building relationships, and social emotional learning. Examples of items to be purchased are sensory sand and magnet blocks.

Sewing Club: A Club would be created for students that like to sew and create. The projects would be items that can be distributed throughout the community, items such as blankets for homeless and animal shelters or lap throws for seniors. Money would be used to purchase sewing machines and materials.

Need to Read: Books would be purchased using the Scholastic Book teacher discount. 150 students would receive a book each month for 7 months.
